Health and Wellbeing in Banchory Academy

We were delighted to welcome Eleanor McIlraith (PT Targeted Support) to the meeting. Mrs McIlraith gave a short presentation of the work that is being undertaken in school to support the mental health and wellbeing of our young people.

This may take the form of *universal support* for everyone, such as the use of materials in a class setting which might consider issues like anxiety, resilience, friendships or social

pressures. This extends beyond just the dedicated PSE period and runs through the entire ethos of the taught day. Further, there are pupil peer-listeners (usually S5/6s supporting younger students) or stress busting workshops, as well as staff specially trained as mental health first aiders, easily identifiable by their green lanyards.

More *targeted support* may be needed by a smaller number of

pupils and there are several staff involved in this provision, including guidance teachers, a dedicated pupil support worker and a trainee counsellor. Throughout the school posters display a QR code, which can be easily scanned to provide a discrete means of accessing support. Several programmes of support can also be accessed via the school, such as LIAM (Lets Introduce Anxiety Management) an 8-10

week programme supported by CAHMS, which can give pupils tools to cope with and manage anxiety. Mrs McIlraith also outlined how the school approaches a sensitive subject like gender dysphoria.

Rector's Report

At each meeting Mrs Wight provides a report on current priorities facing the school. Topics included, amongst others: staffing, school performance indicators, extra-curricular activities (sports, Christmas concert, prize-giving, special services, etc) and the school improvement plan. The full report can be found in the Minutes of the Meeting on the Parent Council section of the school website.

The recruitment of staff and cover for long-term absences continues to be problematic across the entire local authority area and Banchory is reasonably well-served in comparison to some other schools. Priorities for the School Improvement Plan 2022-2023 include developing a shared vision, values and aims for BA and its community, embedding a culture of positive values at all levels, the roll out of the local authority learning and teaching standards assessment policy, and how to support families in order to better support our young people. A proposal to revise how the school curriculum is being delivered is currently under development and further consultation will be undertaken with all stakeholders in the coming months. There will be a focus on attainment in literacy and numeracy across the Banchory cluster and in regard to pupil's wellbeing, the school's antibullying campaign will be launched alongside participation in the national initiative of SHINE (Schools Health and Wellbeing Improvement Research Network).
