Pelcome to the second edition of our newsletter. We are in the middle of exam time for our older pupils and we hope that things are going well for both students and their support crew at home. The S1-3s are preparing for their activities week and the P7s for their transition days. A busy time for all. A lot has also happened in the preceding few months, not least the announcement of the changes to the Nat 5 choices and the changes to come to the school day as a consequence of that.

Since our last newsletter, we have held two meetings of the Parent Council, the minutes of which can be found on the Parent area of the school website:

Topics raised at the meetings not covered in detail below included discussion around whether the school would provide any safe driving workshops in the near future, as has been done in the past? Additionally, several parents have reported their children having issues with the school toilets, involving intimidating behaviour, vaping and vandalism. The school is aware of the problems and implementing several strategies to try and address them. A reminder to all that vaping is not permitted anywhere within Aberdeenshire Council premises and it is against the

law for them to be purchased by anyone under the age of 18. Vapes will be confiscated and disciplinary action taken. Also discussed were the school menu, theft, exam study skills and homework policy. A parent raised a concern that parents are not sufficently informed of upcoming sporting or other extracurricular events, to allow them to discuss this with their child. The approach of the school is to encourage children to become more self-sufficient and they are informed of anything upcoming via assemblies or their teachers. These are also often communicated to parents through the social media channels, in particular Instagram at: banchoryacademy, banchoryacademyartanddesign, banchoryacademype and ba_outdoor_learning.

We have been glad to recently welcome a few new members, but any parent/carer of a Banchory Academy pupil is still welcome to come along, whether you intend to join the PC or simply to see what goes on. We aim to circulate the agenda ahead of the meetings, so you can see if there is a particular area of concern that you might wish to contribute to. Changes to the Curriculum and School Day

At our January meeting, DHT Gill Bruce presented to the PC the proposed changes to the curriculum at Nat 5 level (S4). At present, S3 pupils select four choices to take forward, plus mandatory English and Maths (as well as core PE and RMPS). When the current S2s come to make their choices for S4 in 2024, they will then be able to take a fifth subject, giving seven in total. The choice structure for Highers in S5 will remain the same. To accommodate an extra subject, a new timetable structure is being planned which will see changes to the timing of the school day. This will be discussed with parents next session in more detail. A huge amount of work has gone into planning these changes, including renegotiating contracts with the bus companies, and will hopefully result in a positive outcome for all involved.

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The PTA sadly folded in recent years and it was proposed that it might be time, now that life is returning to normal post-covid, to explore whether there was an appetite for restarting this. The PTA had previously organised several key fundraising events which were enjoyed by all. This idea will be explored further once the new S1s have settled in after the summer break.

Family Learning — Understanding Teams

The school recently ran an information session aimed at helping parents understand how the school makes use of Microsoft Teams to facilitate learning, including for homework. The session was reported to be excellent but poorly attended and the school aims to run it again in the near future.

School Library

Also at the meeting in January, we were delighted to welcome Lizzie Bird, the school librarian. redeveloped library is proving to be a popular and wellused resource, where Mrs Bird aims to offer a safe space with reliable information, as an antidote to a high pressure world and the online environment, where there are few safety nets and it is hard to distinguish good information from misinformation. As well as a good range of books, clubs and activities are on offer, including chess, board games and jigsaws. The library contains over 8000 books, including high interest fiction and non-fiction, careers and exam books, study guides, current affairs magazines and dyslexia appropriate materials. There is even a stationery shop for pupils who might need a piece of equipment. Books can be borrowed from the University of Aberdeen and old books are donated to Better World Books. Not only is the library a physical resource, it is also digital, with access through Teams and the Libby app. Libby is the digital bookshelf of the Aberdeenshire Libraries and has a wide selection of ebooks and audiobooks. Pupils can ask Mrs Bird for a PIN to use with the app.

Many books are still missing since Covid and the school would greatly appreciate any library books that you find at home being returned as soon as possible. Donations of study guides (Nat 5, Higher and Advanced Higher) are also appreciated as these are popular with senior students. The Parent Council was happy to be in a position to make a donation of £500 to the library, which will go towards books, author visits, community reading projects and so on.

Drugs and Alcohol Parent Information Evening
