CfE Levels or Stages

Early	The pre-school years and P1, or later for some.
First	To the end of P4, but earlier or later for some.
Second	To the end of P7, but earlier or later for some.
Third and Fourth	S1 to S3: Broad General Education (BGE). Many pupils will be accessing Fourth level work in S3
Senior Phase	54 to 56 (Senior Phase), in school and/or college or other means of study.





- **S1** –**S3**: Broad General Education
- Based on experiences and outcomes, level 2/3/4
- Progression...personalisation

- **\$4-\$6**: Senior Phase
- Focus on qualifications (not only SQA)
- Qualifications build on the experiences and outcomes of the BGE, levels 3 to 7

Senior Phase Curriculum (S4-6)

- S1 & 2: **16** subjects (some on rota)
- S3: **9 subjects** plus core PE, RMPS, PSHE
- S4: **7 SQA** National 4/5 courses* to include English and Maths
- S5: up to 5 SQA Higher courses or combination N5/4
- S6: usually up to 4 courses, combination can include AH/H/Nationals
- Pupils will be able to pick up National 4 or 5 courses when they are in S5 or S6 to diversify their portfolio of qualifications
- *Pupils may pick up other qualifications such as Volunteering Awards, College awards and Open University qualifications (Flexible pathways)
