Academic Choices new S5

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Pupils must choose 5 subjects

plus 1 "Enrichment" Art / Music / PE / Science

Choices can be...

Progression from S4 (eg Nat 4-> Nat 5 or Nat 5 -> Higher)

Revisit courses from S3 Nat 4/5

Experience new courses

College Link courses

A combination of all of the above

In addition, one PSHE and two study periods

- ▶ Pupils must make four choices* (or 3xAH, 1 FA)
- Choices can be...
- ► Progression (eg Higher -> Adv Higher)
- ► Upgrade subjects from S5 (generally not more than 1)
- ► Revisit courses from S3, S4
- Experience new courses ('crash' course discuss with PT)
- ► Foundation Apprenticeship (counts as 2 courses with placement)

- ► In addition one period for S6 Tutor period with Guidance staff/Briefing with Mrs Wight



Academic Choices new S6

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Personal Development S6

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Pupils are expected to volunteer 1 period per week in a department, as a classroom tutor or dept support.

Pupils are asked to consider 2 further volunteering opportunities, for example

Captains

S1 Buddying

S6 Committees

Extra curricular clubs

Whole school initiatives

University view of S6

Looking for future uni candidates who are independent learners and complete what they start

Looking for candidates who can "juggle" study with involvement in a range of other activities.

Pupils who keep achieving academically throughout S6 will be more likely to successfully transfer to university and survive a first year

Pupils need to check with universities before dropping a subject after a UCAS application has been made



Things to consider

Check

Check college and university prospectuses for entry qualifications – "going rates" may be higher than what appears in the prospectus

Contact

Contact Further and Higher Education admissions offices for advice. Be aware of university entrance requirements

Remember

Remember that entry qualifications will be over one sitting and more will be required over two sittings



Senior phase pupils (S4/5/6) will be timetabled together in some classes

Over subscribed subjects – some pupils will be asked to make a further choice.

Some classes may not be able to run due to staffing

There are often places available after the summer holidays

Undersubscribed subjects – class not likely to run

Points to note







- New S5, pupils should choose 5 courses plus one Enrichment from the list (it is not advised to crash a Higher subject in S5)
- New S6, pupils should choose a minimum of 4 courses from the list on previous page (unless taking 3AH/ 1FA with placement)
- Please take time to research the available options. Use the 'Learner Pathways' website.
 Speak to your Parents/Carers, investigate post 16 pathways and be informed about work/ course entry requirements.
- Please discuss your choice with your subject teacher or see the Principal Teacher of that department, they will initial indicating agreement.
- Complete this form and hand to register teacher/ Guidance <u>staff</u>
- Enter Choices into Online Option Form via Glow Teams (wk beg 26th Feb)
- S6 should indicate their interest in volunteering opportunities in S6

Due to timetable constraints, it is not always possible to guarantee that every <u>combination</u> of subjects will be possible or that every subject will run. You will be consulted before allocating reserve choices.



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
